- 0630 First wave lands on schedule on beach of Normandie France (see Field Order #5, Hq CT 16) and meets fierce resistance on beaches. Beach is under heavy machine gun and rifle fire. No advance made inland as beaches were fully covered by pill boxes and mine fields just inland from beaches.
- 0730 Forward CP lands. Beach still under small arms and machine gun fire. No advance made inland. Casualties extremely heavy. Slight artillery fire on beach. Heavy machine gun fire covering all exits and the entirebeach.
- 0805 Rear CP lands. Beach still under heavy fire. CP established on beach and infiltration started thru right flank of area at small break thru. Mine field cleared out and all troops on beach commence moving off to flank.
- 0830 First four prisoners all from 8th co, 916th Regiment, 352nd Div., brought in.
- 1000 CP established just off beach on side of hill at 6048%. Battalions are moving forward, but are out of contact with regimental CP. Beach and entire territory still under heavy fire and companies are meeting heavy resistance. Several landing craft have received hits and troops still landing on the beach are receiving artillery fire, causing medium casualties. Things are becoming organized, however, and the situation is beginning to clear.
- 1055 1st and 2nd Bns. get contact with the Regimental CP and are moving forward slowly, hitting very heavy resistance.
- 1115 CO to CO 2nd Bn 2nd Bn. is to hold up at point 38. Do not move further forward until you hear from us.
- 1120 S-3 to S-3 1st Bn Hold up at 38. Right, and we have contact with 2nd Bn.
 The 5th Co. is reported to be located at Surrain.
- 1135 Negative report to Division by radio.
- 1145 S-3 to EX 1st Bn-2nd Bn., 18th has landed. They will go in on your right.

 They will take your objective. You dig in and prepare for an counterattack.

 OK. A is on the right, C on the left, with B Co. following. We are still advancing slowly.
- 1145 S-3 to CO 2nd Battalion I talked to Capt. Smith and told him about the 18th.

 How soon can you move the rear part of your CP here by us up forward? We have someone on the way back now to pick them up and guide them forward.
- 1205 Ex 1st Bn to CO-Can We get any tanks up to Colleville-sur-Mer? A: No, none of them are up to new yell There aren't off the beach. However, as soon as we can possible get anything up, we will shoot it up to you. Keep yelling for it BY AUTHORITY OF THE ADJUTANT CENERAL
- 1210 co can co to sand month and the tanks or writty ery up here soon. Will you see DOWN GRAPING about it for us? A-OK.
- 1220 Information received that the 3rd Bn, 18th Inf., was in, but location at the present time was not given. Probably only a rumor.

- 1223 Message to CO 3rd Bn-2nd Bn. has had units in Collevile-sur-Mer for some time. 1st Bn. landed on the left of E-1, and is pushing in to assist the 2nd Bn. in taking its objective.
- 1232 Ex 1st Bn to S-2- A Co. is at 678892. Part of B Co. is with them, and the rest is in reserve. We are going over to Point 19 first, and then towards 38. C is at 681884, moving very slowly. Capt. Merendino, Co. B., said he lost about 12 men from pill boxes firing on them. He couldn't get contact with the Battalion. Major Driscoll said he wanted him over on the right. Major Driscoll to S-3 We are 100 yards NW of 20. We are still pushing.
- 1255 In with 3rd Bn. by wire.
- 1245 Msg. to CG lst Div-Prisoners stated that the CP loth Co., 726th at St.

 Laurent- sur-Mer. CP 12th Co., 726th at Grandcamp-les-Bains. That is in
 the 116th Sector. 916th in sector of 16th Inf. CP, 5th Co., 916th at
 Surrain. The 916th relieved the 915th two weeks ago.
- 1301 Out by wire with 2nd Bn.
- 1312 1st Bn., 18th Inf., lands and is passing thru the CP area, moving forward.
- 1318 Major Lauten to 1st Bn Lt. Kolb is trying to find your CP and will follow the wire line up.
- 1326 S-3 to 2nd Bn Fwd- Where are you? A: CP is now moving forward. We are not in contact with them just now. They took a radio with them to keep in contact with us.
- 1327 S-3 to 1st Bn Are you with Major Driscoll now? A: No, he is at the forward CP and we can't contact him now. However, I can give you the dope.

 A Co. is pinned down by a strong point, just at the head of the draw there at E-2, over by 20, West of Colleville B Co. is going along, sending a couple of sections over to help out C Co. C Co. is 100 yards NW of Point 20. The Naval Shore Fire Control Party is out with Major Driscoll now. The 2nd Bn. is held down. We are in buildings S and E of 20. There is stuff all around. S-3: Artillery fire is coming in on the beach now. A: Well, I can't see where it is coming from up here.
- 1355 White out by wire.
- 1422 More prisoners brought in. Prisoners have been coming in by twos and threes since the landing.
- 1425 Msg. 2nd Bn to CO-Co I held up at Pt 8. Co. I unable to assemble forces to advance and has enemy infiltrating his position. Co. L same situation as Co. I. Co. I and L are just beyond Pt 9. Tanks and reinforcements needed. Time: 1330.
- 1440 1st Bn to 3-2-C Co. the same as before, and B Co. has moved up to the right of them. There is no other change.

- 1502 S-2 to 2nd Bn Have they cleaned out the town yet? A: The last report
 I had a half-hour ago was that they were just on the outskirts of the town.
 I will check by the 300 set and let you know.
- 1515 2nd Bn to S-2-Capt Dawson started into the town. He had a small counterattack. He had a couple of sections as far as the church. Wozenski is
 trying to clean up. Dogtag is going thru the town. S-3: Halftracks are
 in. I am sending them up. What is you CP location? A: The CP is at
 683885. We have contact with the 1st Bn only by means of passing men. The
 2nd Bn., 18th, is passing through. E Co. is working up on the right, between G and Red. We received information from a civilian that there were
 about 150 Jerries in Colleville-Sur-Mer. We have only about 200 men left;
 115 in G, 2 officers and 40 men in E, and 2 officers and 12 men in F.
 There are possibly 20 more around.
- 1540 2nd Bn. to S-2: What is the latest with Blue? A: Not so good. Part of I co. didn't land. Very low on strength.
- 1540 1st Bn to 3-2: C Co. is moving very slowly. B is on our Right, moving slowly, because of machine gun fire. As far as we know, A Co. is in the same spot.
- 1640 S-2 to switchboard: Are we in with Danger Advance? A: No, sir.
- 1725 In by wire with pecoy.
- 1800 Capt. Smith, 1st Bn., to S-2: Major Driscoll says we need stuff up here to take out these pillboxes. If we can't get it, we will be held up. We're leaving this for your consideration.
- 1830 26th Infantry started landing on beach at 1830 hours. A few enemy artillery shells landed near them along the beach. Shortly after, the cruisers and artillery guns opened up for a short period of time.
- 1935 Cruisers and ships firing heavy counter battery on guns firing on beach.
- 1940 Enemy barrage of artillery landing along the beach where the troops are landing. Casualties light.
- 2045 S-4 to Danger 6: Do you have an ammunition supply? A: We don't have any as yet. S-4: Do you have any transportation in yet? A: No. We are getting some in on DUWKS and as soon as they come in, we will send you one of the DUWKS with ammunition. It will come in at E-1.
- 2048 pelight line is out.
- 2100 Capt. Robbins to Major Heath-A German prisoner had two maps on him with 3 spots underlined. Believe they are strong points. These are at 659874, in vicinity of the road; 665874, running along road to the road junction and road north of it at 666875; and at Surrain, they had underlined around 670859. Very little change.

- 2115 Col. Pickett, Div. Sig., to Mr. Wiles-What is your equipment status?

 A: We are very short on our signal equipment. All the men that were carrying equipment were hit and we had to salvage what we could off the beach. Col. Pickett: OK. I will try to get you another signal crew and what equipment I can.
- 2124 Capt. Bour, White 1, to 3-1: Any improvement on the evacuation of wounded? A: If at all possible, we will send them out to the ships tonight. Send them up to us as soon as you can, and we will take care of getting them out.
- 2140 33 18th to 33: Williamson is located just north of goose egg on your map. one company at 702872, one at 702872, one at 695873, and one at 788875. They are advancing to the high ground and then will move toward the West. We are holding back our 1st Bn. Do you have anyone in colleville? A:

 Not that we know. 33 18th: Is your 2nd Bn. at 682878 and your 1st Bn. at 679878? A: Yes, that is right.
- There is a pill box in the draw near Colleville, and its causing us trouble.

 G2: Is the enemy close to the edge of Colleville? A: The 18th is at the top of the hill south of Colleville, but our right flank is still held by the enemy. There is no enemy North of the road except at E-3 exit, where there is a pill box. There's a heavy gun at Formigny and a few small ones at Russy. A few tanks were seen yesterday in Colleville. G2: What about your left company? A: They are on the edge of Lahammerroe. G2: Did you run into any tanks? A: No reports of any today. We got prisoners from 10th and 14th companies. 916th is the only company we are in contact with now. G2: There is a lot of shelling from the southeast and the Maisy area.
- 2205 G3 to S3: Any more dope on your two units near Colleville? The General says that place must be cleaned out tonight. The 18th has two battalions in front of you. A: No, no more dope on them.
- 2242 Danger 4 to 33: Do you know where the temporary vehicle area is? A: Yes.

 It is at 1-1. Capt. Fish has been out there. G4: I'm setting up a
 temporary ammunition dump there. The ammunition will be rationed. Do you
 know anything about the 116? A: Yes. They are getting along OK. They
 are southwest of St. Laurent. Capt Toby, 7th FA to 32:
- 2255 Capt Toby, 7th FA to S2: I had a report from a Medic that people in St.

 Laurent had 29 Jerries billeted with them. They left tonite and were to
 meet in Louvieres.

7 June 44 0655 - S3 to S3 1st Bn: What is your situation? A: We have just contacted two outfits from the 116. The 18th is having trouble and we and they both need tanks and self propelles. What about anti-tank guns? 33: Fish sent three guns to you a little while ago. 0655 - S3 to CO Can Co.: How may guns have you got? A: None. I have Carpenter on the beach looking for them. There are a couple of half-tracks in the transit area and if we can get them, we can get through some of these roads. S3: Have you seen any of your men? A: I understand the overstrength came in, but they haven't showed up yet. S3: OK, I'll check on that for you. I will check on Your guns and let you know one way or another. 0825 capt Hall to S2: I just sent back 40 or 50 prisoners. Remainder of that company of 716th, so they decided to give up. They said there was another CP in town, but they didn't know the strength or location. G Co. is up there doing dkay. A few of our L Co. men were taken prisoner yesterday by these people, and today they gave up, so the L Co. men brought them back. 0832 col. Sternburg to S3: We are having some mortar fire on our 1st Battalion. Can it be from your guns? A: No, it isn't as I just checked, but I will check again, with col. Hicks to be sure. 0816 - CO AT Co to CO 1st Bn: I have 9 AT guns, and will put them on the three approaches. A: OK, that's fine. Msg. Center to 2nd Bn: Would like to get a report of what material and signal equipment you lost on the beach so that we can put in for replacement. 83 to 00 2nd Bn: Are you firing your 4/2 mortars? A: No, I am not 0837 firing a thing. There is some artillery fire near here, but I'm not firing a thing. 0842 - White I to SI: We can give you a rough estimate of the men we have. We have about 380 men and officers left in the battalion. Most of those are Hq. and H. Co. We may find a few more. 0900 - S2 to G2: We have two officers from 3rd Battery, 352nd Artillery Regiment, and 2nd Battalion, 915th Infantry Regiment. From civilians, we learned they arrived in colleville between 9 and 10 AM on D Day. One prisoner believed 726th was part of 352nd Div. 3rd Co. CP reported in Colleville. 2nd co. is believed in Arromanch. Yesterday afternoon three men from L Co., 16th were captured and taken to colleville. Last night the Germans shot their captain and made arrangements with the L Co. men to surrender. Two wounded and 50 others surrendered. G2: We have opened up our PW cage now. Sgt. Collura to Sgt. Rodgers, Danger 3: Can you give me an idea of your location? A: at 671893. -1-

- 0940 Sgt. Rodgers, Danger 3: The location I gave Sgt. Collura was correct.
- 0940 Forward CP prepared to move out.
- 0945 Brief case with Capt. Stowell's papers is at Marble CP.
- 0950 Lt. Carroll to s-2: British have taken Caen and the 4th Division is pushing up.
- 0955 It Walker to 32: There are 6 prisoners coming in from the 320th Div.
- 0956 G3 to S3: What's the situation? A: G Co. has gone through Colleville.
 Col. Horner has tanks with him and is as far as Hamel. 115th has
 taken St. Laurent sur Mer, getting prisoners. Rangers are with them.
 Paratroops have landed OK. Cannon Co. DUKWS are all sunk. There may
 be some on another beach.
- 1010 Advance CP moves out to new location forward.
- 1012 S2 to G2: We have a Prisoner from Hq 2nd Bn., 915th Regiment. He gave information that the 915th Regiment had a CP at Montigny at the time we attacked. They rode bicycles 40 kilometers from Montingny to colleville. The Commanding Officer of the 2nd Battalion is Captain Lohmann. Their headquarters Lieutenant was killed. The CO of the 915th is Lieut. Col. Meyer. The whole of the 2nd Battalion was to be committed in Colleville on 6 June. They suffered heavy casualties during the bombing. The prisoners were captured just east of Colleville. They include a Hq. Co. driver. The prisoner said they expected tanks tonight, 7 June, or tomorrow morning. G2: I don't have much to tell you. Trevieres got a plastering from the air corps. Surrain is still held by the 916th.
- 1027 Col Baker to S2: We have some naval people here who are standing by and want to shoot if you have a target. They will spot it from the air. If your 3rd gattalion has anything to shoot at, call me back.
- 1050 33 to 32: I am at 2nd Bn CP. Hicks is moving his CP to Colleville.

 Snipers are harrassing road in the vicinity of Colleville. I don't
 think it worth while to move such a short distance. A: Col. Taylor says
 we must move the CP forward. 33: I'd like to move CP east of Colleville, but can't do it.
- 1102 G3 to S2: General Huebner directs that the 3rd Bn. of the 26th attached to you be given the mission of seizing your 3rd Bn.'s objective.

- 1105 S2 to G3: The General already talked to the Colonel about that Bn of the 26th. Col Horner coordinated the attack. A: OK. The 231 Brigade is in Bayeux, you know. S2: Yes, we already knew about that
- 1130 92 to 62: We have a civilian, reserve officer in the French Air Corps, active in the underground. He is wounded. He speaks English. He gave us the information that there were 155 guns at 715853 at Le Berts.
 Also, 155s at 895852, Hauteville, and 155s at 657874, Hq of an artillery Regiment (Saxony) at Mosles. Tour en Bessin is the home of the company of the Saxony Regiment. At Etreham is a supply depot with horse drawn transport. There are 700 to 1000 at Trevieres. Also, there are tanks at Mandeville. The enemy has pulled out during the night, and left small detaining detachments. G2: OK. The only thing I have is that the British have pushed forward.
- 1145 Red 3 to s2: C co. has moved out. Forward elements of C are 400 yards mortheast of 49 on the road junction, in all around defensive positions. No contact yet, but there is a fire fight going on in the vicinity of 38. B Co. is on the right rear of C Co. A Co. is on C Co.'s left rear. Col. winters thought they heard tanks out front. We have plenty of anti-tank stuff around 20. Who cleaned out the road from 19 to 20? A: We thought you did. Red 3: No, we haven't. A: Well, I'll tell the Colonel. Red 3: B Co. just called and said they were friendly tanks. What's the picture? A: We're pushing, but we are doing the worst.
- 1150 32 to 33: What about us moving up? A: Soon as we get switchboard in.
 It's still bad here. Plenty of snipers. One man here in the CP just got wounded. But its the only place to go. 32: The British moved in front of our sector, in front of L Co. The Colonel ordered the 3ed Bn. to move out and seize their objectives.
- 1205 Major Rippert to 32: Will you give my battalion the coordinates of our CP at 678894, when you get in touch with them. There is still sniping going on in St. Laurent, but our battalions are going right inland east of the town. 32: Okay, I'll give your battalion your coordinates. No word from them since they or the 3rd pn. shoved off.
- 1215 Rear CP closes out.
- 1225 Rear CP arrives at forward CP location at 683890.
- 1245 The British have Caen and Bayeux and the 4th Division and Paratroop Divisions are in and things are looking up.

- 1315 33 to 63: Our CP is at 683890. As soon as I can, we will move to 681880. 63: 670893 is pivision CP coordinates. 2nd Rn., 18th is having quite a fight and they have taken about 90 prisoners. We have lots of air here so if you have any targets, let us know. 33: When is the 2nd Division coming in? A: Sometime this afternoon.
- 1324 S2 to G2: One prisoner from the 1st Battalion, 352nd Artillery
 Regiment. The Regiment consists of four battalions: 1st, 2nd, and
 3rd Battalions with 105s, and the 4th Battalion consists of 150s.
 The 1st Battery is 4 Kilometers south of Surrain. They were disposed
 from east to west in the order 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th.
- 1327 Capt. Brooks to 54: I am at Division and they want a periodic report in tonight. The ration dump will open at 1600 hours today and we have a water point but I don't have the coordinates. I will get them. Will you have all the battalions and special units bring in their periodic reports tonight to the ammunition dump? A: OK.
- . 1415 Decoy reported moving forward by the Dagwood operator.
 - 1435 Col Hicks to Sgt Collura: In regard to the mortar fire that Major Plitt and I talked about, we are ready here. We have men on the knoll ready to trap them when they come out. A: Major Plitt is usingh the bridge as the right boundry. The Coordinates are 686886. Col Hicks: That's OK.
 - 1437 Col Hicks to Sl: How about getting some Graves Registration people out here? A: Capt Groves will take care of that very soon. Col. Hicks: Let me know about this. There are dead all along the road betw ween you and me and this isn'tt good for the morale.
 - 1450 300 Msg from CO 3rd Bn to CO: We are in vicinity of 24. Are proceeding on mission.
 - 1451 Red 2 to Sl: Do we have anyone in the vicinity of Surrane at all?

 A: No we do not. Red 2: We are going to shell in there. Sl:

 The 18th may be in there. Check it. Red 2: OK.
 - 1511 White 2 to 52: We are sending you about 23 men and one officer as prisoners of war. We gathered them out of the Exit 3 strong point.

 A: That must be the same outfit that we are putting mortar fire on now at 686886. White 2: Yes, that is the place. A: Capt. Hall and some men are going down there now. This will clean them out if there are any left.

- 1600 Red 2 to S2: There are 21 mines laid in the road bed at 681868, 10 mines at 681869, and 9 mines at 678868. The left flank of F co. is 684870. F co. is the left company. Right flank of B co is at 668874.
- 1600 33 Prisoners received.
- 1610 s3 to Red 6: Assume positions formerly assigned to 2nd Battalion.
- 1615 300 Msg from pagwood Blue: We are in the vicinity of 28 and 29.
- 1650 Advance CP group moves out for new CP.
- 1745 Capt Fish to Lt Kunze: Get in a jeep and go up on a reconaissance.

 We are going to set up a CP at 682880, crossroads east of Colleville.

 Regiment is going into that vicinity.
- 1750 It kunze to 33: can the minefield around the CP be moved? A: Yes.
- 1800 Radio Msg: CP 18th located at 672888.
- 1810 Col Hicks to 53: We are moving up at 1830. E Co. will take up position 41. G Co. will take up position 42 (at crossroads just back of 42, near St. Angus). Has the 18th moved out? A: Yes. Col. Hicks: What's on my left? A: British have definitely taken St. Honorine, butthe enemy is reported to hold a part of Port En Bessin. Col Hicks: OK, I will leave a rear CP.
- 1830 sl to capt Smith: Has your strength changed any? A: No. 32:

 any information from your patrols? A: Yes, were now getting machine gun fire on our right flank, and replying with the same. We ran into a bivouac area and have gathered up documents and a bunch of stuff.
- 1857 pagwood Fwd reports in by phone, and has line with Danger Fwd.
- 1858 sgt collura to capt Ralph: Do you want us to move up? A: Move up but maintain the rear board.
- 1910 closed out rear CP and moved forward.
- 1945 Rear group arrives forward.
- 1948 pagwood Blue to CO: Our forward CP is at point 29, with I co and L co at point 10. M co is at point 27. We are sending motorized and foot patrols to point 12.

- 2020 S2 to Danger 3: The 3rd Bn is progessing with little reistance toward 725 easting. 1st Bn., 26th Inf., is there. The 3rd Bn. is beyond St. Honorine.
- 2023 Col Hicks to s3: I have two sections of the 2nd Bn., 116th with me.
- 2028 S3 to G3: We are now at 680881. Gr: Williamson is in the town and is cleaning it up. S3: Hicks has E Co. at 702868, G Co. at 711870. G3: We are trying to get something for the future. We don't know the Division boundaries yet.
- 2030 Msg from CO 26th Inf: White Bn, Dextrose proceeding southeast in fromt of your RED and WHITE, then south of Red Bn. Dextrose to attack ridge at 720830. Notify all units where Red Bn of Dextrose is.
- 2035 Lt Carroll to Col Grant: Would you verify this message (above). A:
 Yes, they will be on the high ground where Red And White are now.
- 2044 Lst Bn. sends in negative report.
- 2055 G2 to S2: What identifications did you get from in front of Red?

 A: We got about 25 prisoners from the 1st Company, 726th. Light resistance and no report. G2: Did you get any artillery fire over there? A: No. G2: We would appreciate it if you sent prisoners back to the cage from now on. We have several prioners who are government workers, and we are sending them back to the cage.
- 2102 S3 to Dagwood Red: Just a little information for you, and we want your location. Just to the left and a little below that is a little town called Bicert (710870) is E Co. What is your location? A: C Co. is 6787 grid, at 675872 they are. Out that road to the east is A Co. To the west is B Co. The CP is 677874, in the corner of the large orchard. Our antitank guns are at 674872. The first is to fire southeast and the other to the south. L Co is at 725882. I is at 722877. Both are working to the Mast. They haven't contacted the British. K Co. is holding a postition at 719816. Who holds Surrain? A: The 18th is down there. The 18th is supposed to be in Formigny and push down to your front.
- 2120 Capt Clark to Dag Red: Is that artillery falling near you? A: No, this it is landing across the road from B Co., due east from us.
- Anything in reference to York? A: 656858 is the center of his mass.

 S3: How about Crowley? A: At 656877. S3: How about Farminia? A:

 It hasn't been taken; they are going to dig down for the night. S3: Our

 situation is this: 3rd Bn CP 720881, L Co. at 740877, I Co. at 733873,

 K Co. at 722879. The 2nd Bn and 3rd Bn will tie up at the CP of the 3rd.

 S3: How about the 18th? A: Northeast about 500 yards, at 677864. S3:

 How about Port en Bessin? A: Patrols are going in there. S3: How

 about the 26th Infantry? A: 1st Bn is on the high ground at 733868, under

York and Cooley having somewhat of a time. The 2nd Division is going in on our right, cleaning up pockets and go between us. More Armored going to them. Williamson having somewhat of a time.

- 2250 Major White to Major Plitt: Kemp contacted the British for us. The British took Port en Bessin about seven tonight. They are going to evacuate their wounded thru us. Capt. Carmichael says the 1st Bn. of Dextrose is at Point 64.
- 2120 Major Gale to Major Lauten: What is the dope on the patrol you sent to Port en Bessin? A; It is a two man patrol and they encountered the enemy defending the east and west. The British are advancing on the city just a squickly as possible. We caught a wire man in the bunch and he said the 726th CP is located in a chateau in Sully (767826). What are we to do with these civilians who we have picked up and have been working on defenses for the Germans? A: Turn them over to the Civil Affairs Officer for interrogation and disposition.
- Major Gale to Major Lauten: How many PWs did you take? A: About 150. Major Gale: See many German dead? A: Hardly any, but we have taken some wounded. Major Gale: How was the morale of the PWs? A: Very low, and most of them don't give a damn. Major Gale: Did any of them have any knowledge of the landings along the coast?
